Week 8: Minority Report

In God's Big Story

The Israelites struggled with trusting God and often doubted His plans. Even after witnessing many miracles, they wanted to return to Egypt rather than continue following God's path to the Promised Land. Despite the fears of others, Caleb and Joshua trusted in God's promises and encouraged the Israelites to move forward.
