In God's Big Story

Korah was from the tribe of Levi, and he unhappy with his role assisting the priest He quickly became jealous of Moses and Aaron. Table Talk or Car Chats

Families, use these questions to prompt conversations at the table, in the car, and anywhere else your family experiences life together.

- Has there ever been a time when you felt jealous of someone or something he or she had?
- Why should we avoid being jealous of others?
- What can we learn from how Moses and Aaron responded to challenges?
- How can you cultivate a heart of contentment and trust in God's plan for your life?

Walk it. Act it. Move it.

Good vs. Bad Choices

Discuss the concept of jealousy and how it can lead to bad decisions. Use real-life examples (appropriate for your child's age) and talk about how to overcome jealousy.

Respectful Walk

Have children walk around the room pretending to be Israelites on their journey. When you say "respectful walk," the children should walk calmly and quietly. When you say "grumbling walk," the children should walk with hunched shoulders and make grumbling noises (like the Israelites who complained about God).
